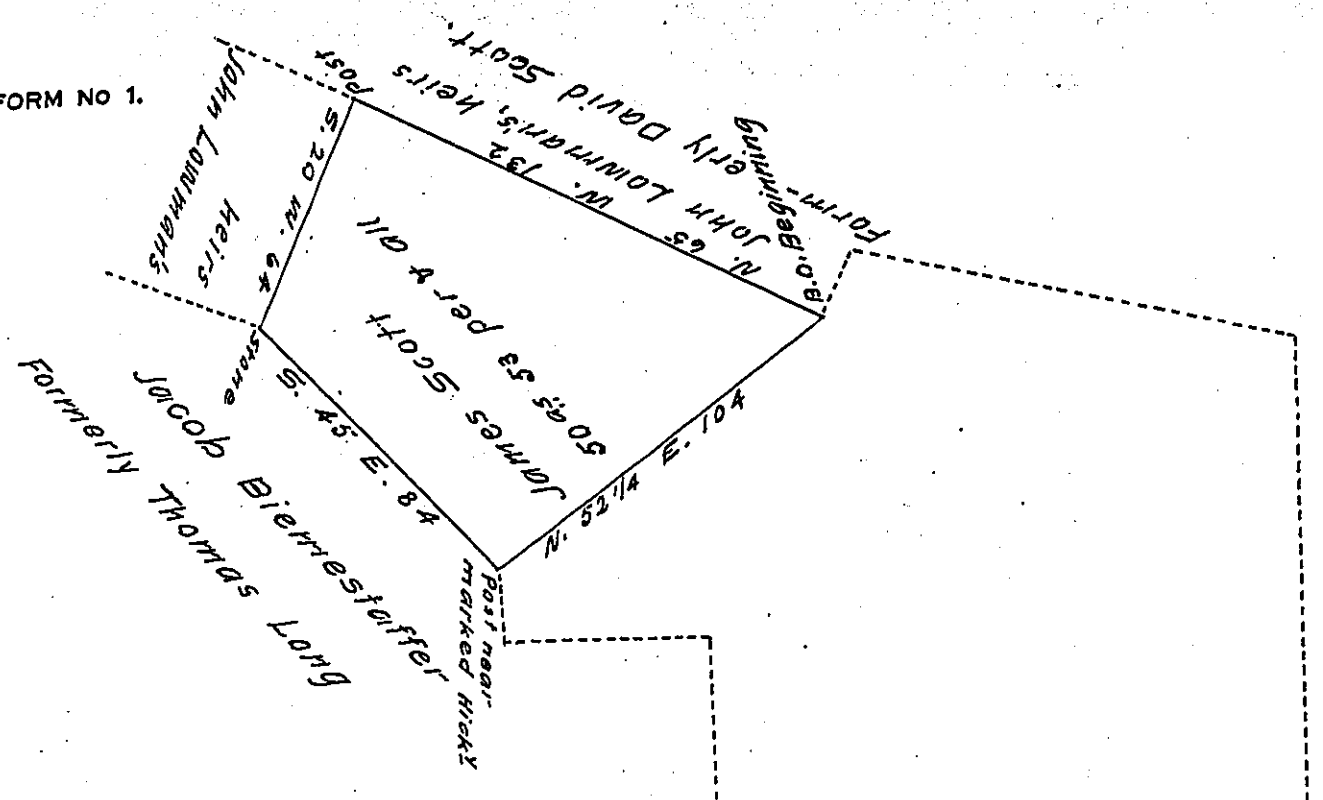


FORM NO 1.



Draft of a tract of land situate in Antrim township Franklin County containing fifty acres fifty three perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> of November 1827 (on a Warrant granted James Scott for 50<sup>95</sup> of land joining David, Thomas Long & James McClanahan, in Antrim township dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of June 1762.) In pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.
