



Situate in Penns township Union County surveyed the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April 1837 by virtue of a warrant granted to Jacob Young, dated the 21<sup>st</sup> February 1755 containing fifty acres & twenty five perches & the usual allowance & is represented by the Green lines.

Note. The same interferences & is included in a larger survey made the 22<sup>d</sup> day of October A.D. 1765 for Philip Conrad Aumiller in pursuance of his warrant bearing date the 5<sup>th</sup> of June 1755 & is now owned & occupied by the heirs of And<sup>e</sup> Shaffer, in right of the said P.C. Aumiller, & is represented by the red lines.
