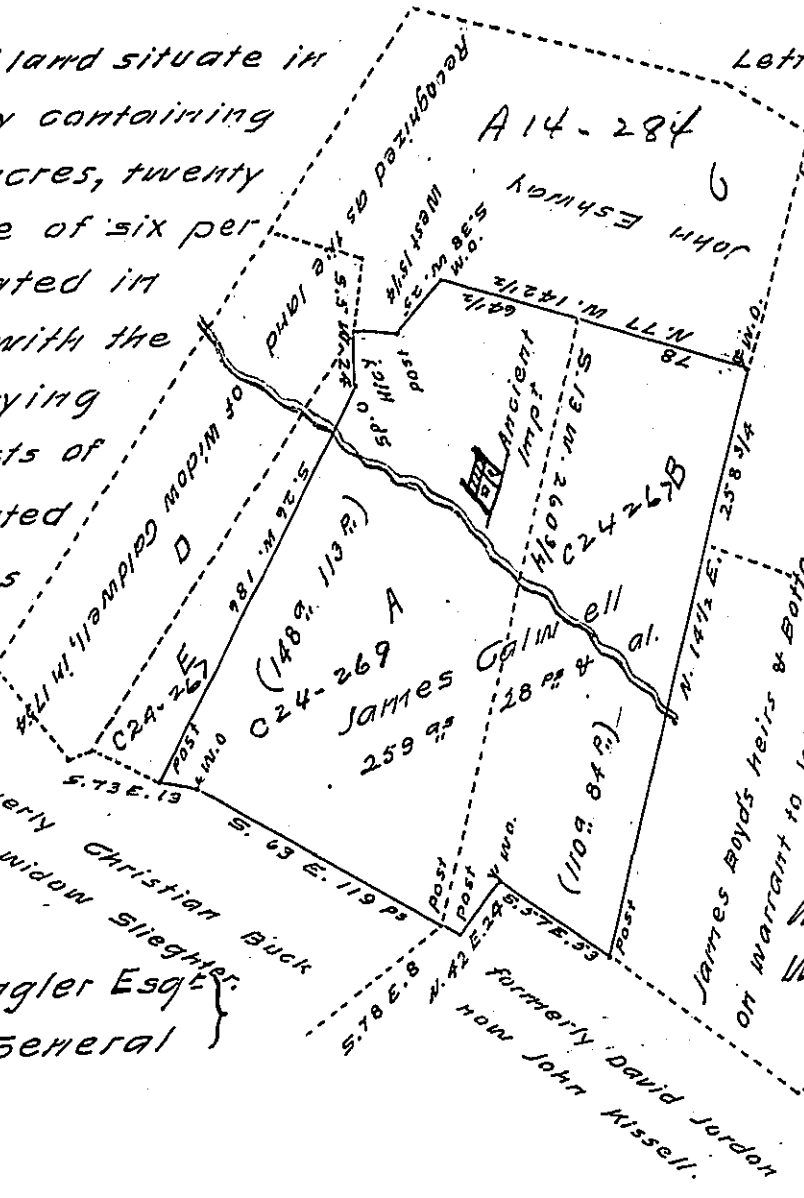

Report. The above tract is covered by the following office rights to wit:
The part marked A & separated from B. by dotted line containing 148^o 113^o & al was survey^d 1st May 1792. on warrant to Stephen Caldwell, dated 10th Feb^y 1792 which is presumed to include the ancient seat of Jas^s Caldwell as marked on the draught. The part marked B. survey^d for Stephen Caldwell, the same time on warrant to Robert Caldwell, dated 22nd Feb^y 1787. as per official surveys in office.
The dotted figures without the above survey recognized as the land of widow Caldwell, in 1754 by an adjoining survey. The figure C. survey^d on warrant to Rob^t Caldwell, dated 1st September 1787. The figure D. survey^d on warrant to John Caldwell, dated 24th Feb^y 1786. The figure E. survey^d on warrant to Nicholas Eshway, dated 14 Aug^t 1794. who then owned the land now returned. Owned & occupied by Jacob Martin & David Sleghter, under the above title to Stephen & Robert Caldwell
