



Draft of a tract of land situate in Antrim township Franklin County containing three hundred and sixty one & three fourth acres & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. located the 2nd of March 1830 (on a warrant granted Benjamin Chambers, for 200 acs of land joining Thomas Brown, in Antrim township dated the 1st of August 1755) by virtue of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.
