



Draft of a tract of land situate in Washington township Franklin County (formerly Antrim township) containing sixty one acres & allowance of six per cent for roads & which was surveyed the 6th of Feb^y 1761 on a warrant granted Henry Keefer for 50^{a.} of land joining John Storer & Edward Nicholas in the East forks of Anti-tem in Antrim township dated the 17th of December 1750 certified the 8th of May 1830 in pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights *vs.*
