



Draught of a tract of land situate in Southampton township Franklin County containing five acres one hundred & forty eight perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyd 17 Sept<sup>r</sup> 1829. In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under Proprietary rights &c, and by virtue of a warrant dated 14 June 1765 granted to William Irwin, for 25 acres" joining his other land in Lorain alias Lurgan township"

Note - The above piece of land was surveyed (with some variation from the above lines;) by Matt<sup>w</sup> Henderson, formerly D.S. on the 30<sup>th</sup> August 1794 for which (it was stated) a warrant had been granted to W<sup>m</sup> Irwin, for 25<sup>a</sup>. dated on or about the 10<sup>th</sup> of July 1765 query as to a warrant of that date.
