



Draught of a tract of land situate in Fannet township Franklin County containing 237 acres 104 perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c resurveyed 27 October 1829. In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under Proprietary rights &c, and by virtue of a warrant dated 8th June 1762 granted to James Long for 200 acres in Path Valley "joining James Balbreaths tract of 200 acres"

Report - The above tract was surveyed 26 May 1763 in dispute between James Balbreath and James Long, an warrants to both parties as appears by an old draft found in office - No other land found applicable to Long's warrant. Note - Appears also to have been returned on a warrant to James Balbreath dated 20 Feb^r 1755 as per list No. 1 of unpatented lands, and held under said title
