 which was surveyed 18 May 1767 on an order of survey to John Jack
 dated 4 February 1767, No 2683, & confirmed by patent to Danl Huston
 28 April 1806. Note-The three figures A, B & C embrace the survey of
 John Jack aforesaid.

Note-The two figures A & B taken together appears to have been
 covered or attempted to be covered by a warrant to John Meek
 for 75 A^c dated 11 Dec^r 1793.
