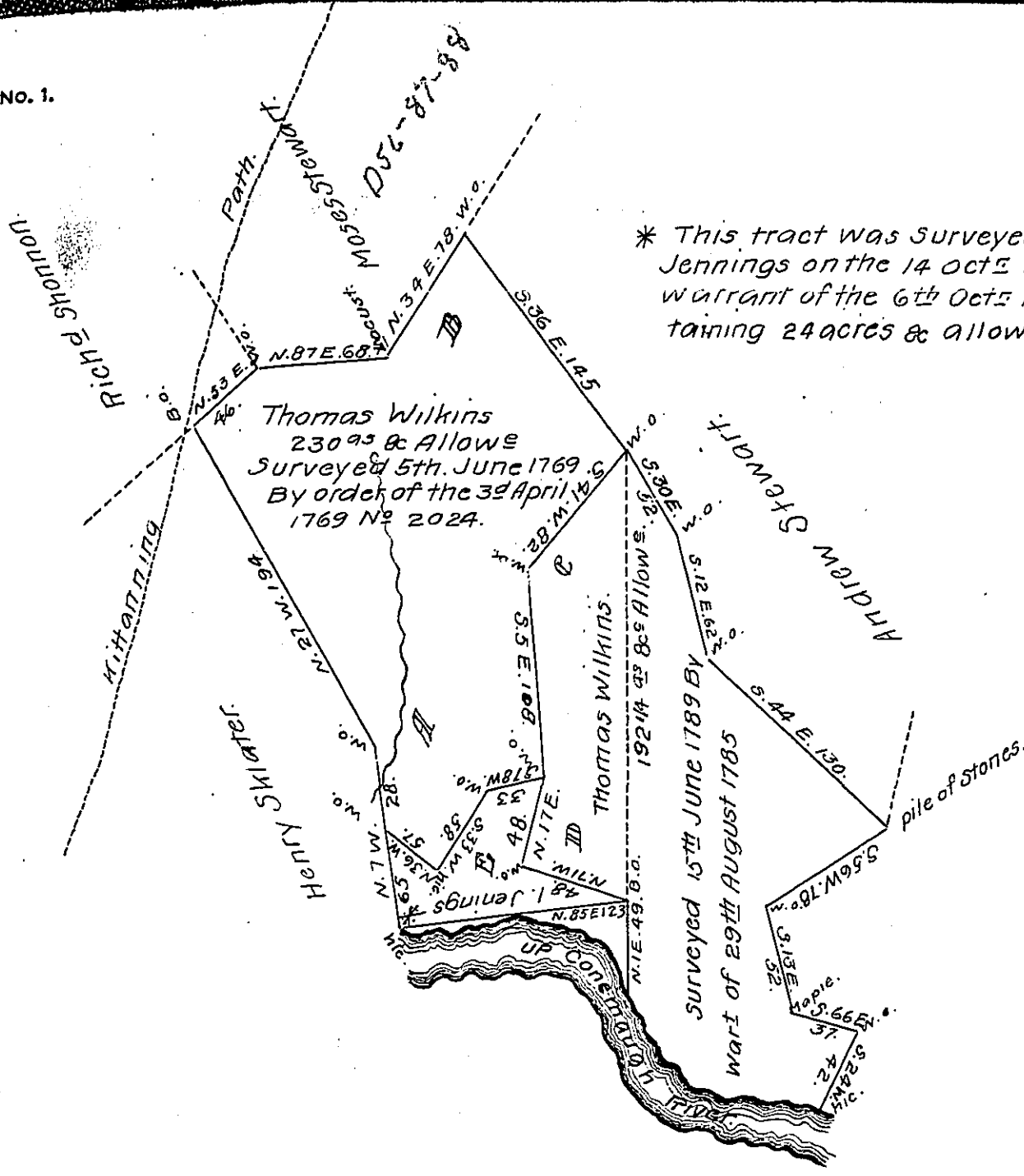

The dotted line and the letters A B C D & E on the above diagram represent a survey made to <sup>Samuel</sup> ~~Isaac~~ Culbertson on the 20<sup>th</sup> of February 1828 in pursuance of a Location granted to him the 3<sup>d</sup> April 1769 No 1873 It will be seen by the dates entered in the above drafts that the land called for by <sup>Samuel</sup> ~~Isaac~~ Culbertson's Location and upon which it has been Paid has been previously <sup>Samuel</sup> ~~Isaac~~ appropriated. David Lintner and Abner Wittels reside upon this tract and claim under the title to Thomas Wilkins - Isaac Thomas is the owner of the tract Surveyed to Isaac Jennings.
