



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Location or other Office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and by the authority of the Board of property I have this 8th day of May 1828 Surveyed the above described Tract of land containing Two hundred and sixty five acres & six tenths of an acre allowance of six per Cent on the West side of the Kittanning Path joining Geo. Armstrong waters running into Blacklick (Blacklegs) creek and Conemaugh, Situate in Conemaugh Township Indiana County By virtue of a Location granted to James Armstrong on the 3^d of April 1769 No 2407.
