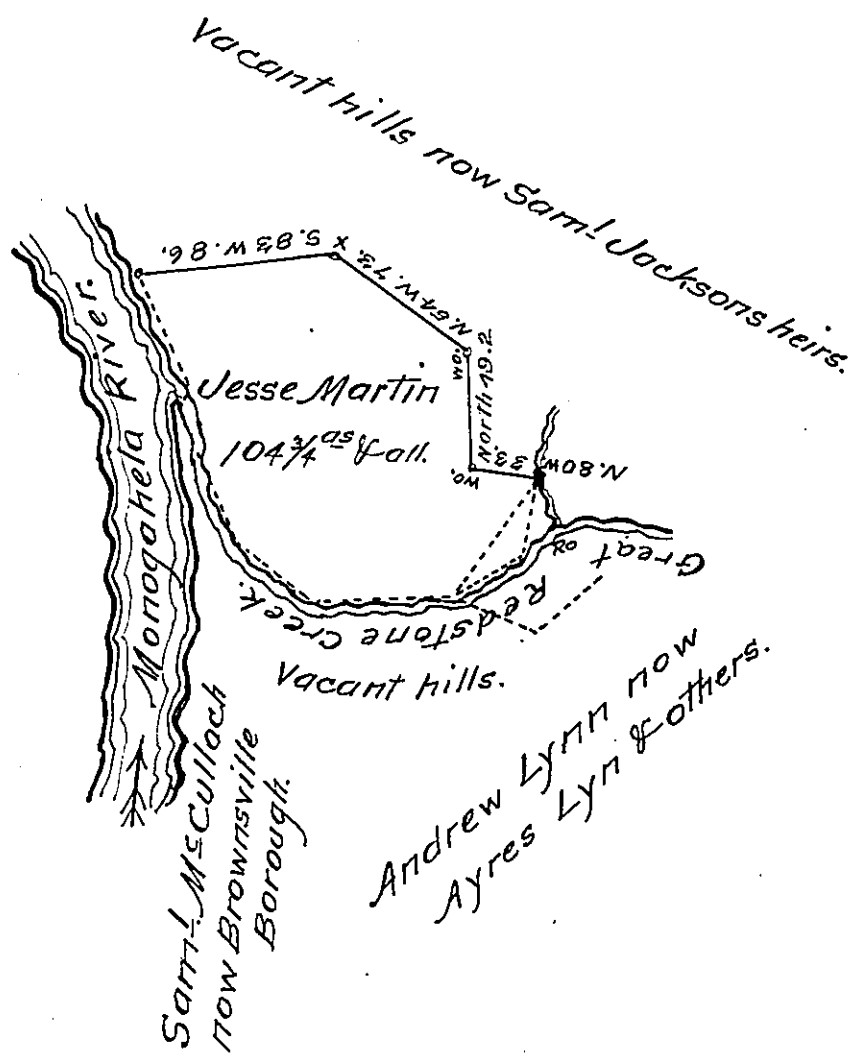

" Situate on the east side of the Monongahela River on the mouth of Great Redstone Creek and surveyed the 19th day of July 1770, on a ticket from Prior Theobald who ordered me to survey it for S. Martin, he having an order of survey No. 3156 in the name of William Jacobs for the same, dated the 24th day of April 1769 for 300 acres

This is the only survey which I can find to have been made on the ground occupied by Jesse Martins old improvement, and is the same described in his Order, No 2444 of 3^d Ap^l 1769. the land is in Washington Township about one mile from Brownsville, is highly improved; a small part owned by "Bowman & Sweitzer" of the new "Obany Glass works" the remainder by Rebecca Bailey, formerly - Rebecca Jackson, daughter of Saml Jackson decd. who formerly owned this survey.
