



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of  
 near North Wales  
 May 1734 Surveyed unto Solomon Hopton a tract of land situate in the  
 County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a post in a line of Howell Powells  
 Land thence by the same North East ninety-five perches to a post  
 thence by land of James Dunn South East one hundred seventy-  
 nine perches to a post thence by land of John Bartholemew South  
 West ninety-five perches to a post thence by land of Edward Wells  
 north west one hundred seventy-nine perches to ye place of Beginning.  
 Containing one hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six & Cent.
