



By Virtue of a warrant from the proprietaries dated the seventh day of March 1733 Surveyed unto Charles Hunter a tract of Land situate in Oley — in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a post thence by vacant land south seventy degrees East one hundred and sixty perches to a corner stone thence by vacant land north twenty degrees East one hundred & fifty-nine perches to a white-oak thence by vac<sup>t</sup> land north seventy degrees West one hundred and sixty perches to a corner stone thence by vacant land south twenty degrees west one hundred and fifty-nine perches to the place of beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six & Cent.
