 West by Shackamax- Land 350 Pearches to a corner marked white oake  
 being y<sup>e</sup> uper-corner bounded tree of y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> land of Shackamaxon from  
 thence east north east by a line of marked trees 150 pearches to a cor-  
 ner marked black-oake standing nigh unto Quesscomaman Creek side  
 opposett to y<sup>e</sup> mouth of Taconick Creek & from thence down y<sup>e</sup> severall  
Courcess of y<sup>e</sup> maine Creeke to y<sup>e</sup> maine River-side & from y<sup>e</sup> mouth of  
 Quesscomaman Creeke down by y<sup>e</sup> River & by y<sup>e</sup> swamp or Crippe lying  
 by y<sup>e</sup> River side to y<sup>e</sup> first mentioned Corner-oake containing & laid  
 out for 650 acres of land Together with y<sup>e</sup> meadow-ground thereunto  
 adjoyning. Surveyed the 24 day of 9<sup>br</sup> 1675/
