

By Virtue of a Warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the Seal of the Province bearing date the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> mo<sup>n</sup> 1703 for Resurveying of Lands in the County of Chester There was Resurveyed in the 4<sup>th</sup> mo. in the year aforesaid unto Elizabeth Cookson a tract of land in Middletown in the County aforesaid beginning at a Walnut tree by Ridley Creek at a corner of Hollingsworths Land thence South fifty five degrees west by the said Hollingsworths <sup>worths</sup> Line three hundred and thirty six perches to a white oak thence south thirty five degrees east Seventy Six perches to a Spanish Oak Then by Rich<sup>d</sup> Crosby's land North fifty five degrees east two hundred forty six perches to a white oak by a Run. Then by the said Run Seventy Six Perches to the 5<sup>d</sup> <sup>by y<sup>e</sup> several Courses of the 5<sup>d</sup> Creek.</sup> Ridley Creek - thence ~~the same~~ to y<sup>e</sup> place of beginning Containing one hundred and fifty acres
