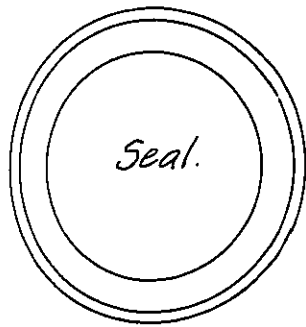


Pennsylvania

By the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property

Whereas James Chevers settled about three years agoe on presumption on part of the Prop<sup>rs</sup> Mannor of Rocklands hath requested us to grant him two hundred Acres of Land within the same where he is now seated adjoining on Concord Line & near Nath<sup>l</sup> Newlin's Tract for which he hath agreed to pay to the Prop<sup>rs</sup> Use fifty pounds at certain fixt times before and at the 29<sup>th</sup> of Septemb<sup>r</sup> next as also three years Rent for the time past at one penny Sterling for every Acre P. Annum = These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the s<sup>d</sup> James Chevers the s<sup>d</sup> number of Acres in the place afores<sup>d</sup> and make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case the s<sup>d</sup> James fulfill the s<sup>d</sup> agreem<sup>t</sup> shall be valid otherwise shall be void and of no effect as if the same had never been made. Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 22<sup>d</sup> of ye 10<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701-
