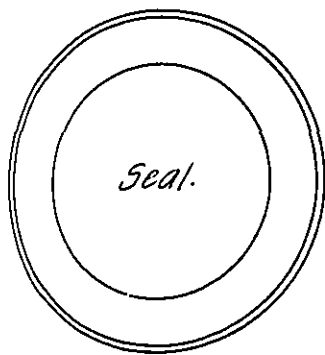


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Richard Cloud of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up Six hundred and fifty acres of Land on the branches of Pequea—in the said County including within the same the improvement by him already made for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Seventy eight Pounds for the whole and the usual yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every Hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Richard Cloud according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Six hundred and fifty acres of land including within the lines <sup>thereof</sup> the said improvement Provided the same be Cleare of all other Lawfull claims and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office Which Survey in case the said Richard Cloud fulfill the above agreement at or before the Twentieth day of the next Sixth month shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month Anno Dom 1715
