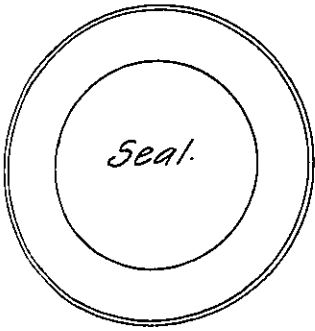

By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas the former Commissioners of Property did by their Warr<sup>t</sup> in the year 1692 grant unto Oliver Cope in the Mannor of Rockeland Seventy Acres of Land adjoining on y<sup>e</sup> Tract whereon he was then Seated reputed to Contain One hundred & thirty Acres to make up the same two hundred: In lieu of which it is agreed that there shall be granted to W<sup>m</sup> Cope Son & heir of y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>d</sup> Oliver ~~fourty~~ forty five Acres if it conveniently may be: These therefore are to Authorize thee to Survey to y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>d</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Cope the full quantity of one hundred and Seventy five Acres including his whole Tract in the s<sup>d</sup> place bounding y<sup>e</sup> same to y<sup>e</sup> Northeast with a division line between him and y<sup>e</sup> land now granted to J<sup>n</sup><sup>o</sup> Prev. ~~and~~ to y<sup>e</sup> Southwest with y<sup>e</sup> ~~present~~ line of the 5<sup>d</sup> 130 Acres extended towards y<sup>e</sup> Kingsroad & to y<sup>e</sup> South-East at its utmost extent whether it shall contain the s<sup>d</sup> quantity or otherwise with the s<sup>d</sup> Kingsroad But in case the s<sup>d</sup> Tract between the s<sup>d</sup> Northeast & Southwest Bounds his headline on Jer: Cloud & y<sup>e</sup> kings road shall be found to contain above y<sup>e</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> quantity of One hundred & Seventy five Acres. Thou art then to cutt off what Overplus there shall be found next to y<sup>e</sup> Kings road or where it may appear ~~best~~ for y<sup>e</sup> Prop<sup>rs</sup> best Conveniences: And make returns into y<sup>e</sup> General Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by y<sup>e</sup> Secretary for w<sup>ch</sup> Land hereby granted the s<sup>d</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Cope is to pay one Penny Sterl. P. Acre P. An<sup>o</sup>. Given under our hands & y<sup>e</sup> Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> 11<sup>mo</sup> 1702
