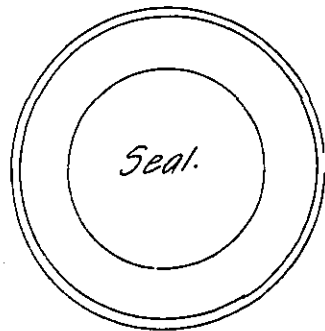


Pensilvania *ps.*



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jeremiah Carter of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up in right of him and ^{his wife} one hundred acres of Land they having made it appear to us that they came Servants into this Province in the year 1682 And also that we would grant him to take up one hundred and fifty acres of land in Right of Henry Swift and his Wife and Rich^d Whigsted who also came Servants into this Province about ye aforesaid year and have now sold their several Rights to ^{ye sd} Jeremiah Carter These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Jeremiah Carter the aforesaid two parcells of Land containing together two hundred and ffifty acres that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians To be holden of the Proprietor under the yearly Quitrent of one Halfpenny Sterling for every Acre and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation. Given under our Hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 24th day of the third month Anno Di 1715
