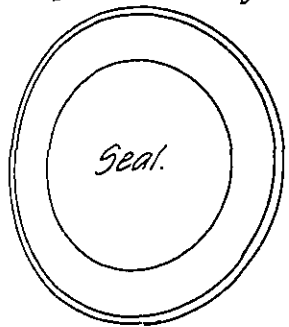


Pennsylvania *ps.*

By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an agreement now made with Herman Casdorp of Philadelphia Shipwright for five hundred acres of land on the West side of the River Schuylkill including within the same y^e Tract called Turkey Point for which he is to pay to the Proprietors Use at or upon the Survey thereof One hundred Pounds Money of Pennsylvania for the whole (or within Six Months with Interest) and the yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres. These are to authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Herman Casdorp in the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of Land And take within the lines thereof the said Turkey Point provided the same hath not been Survey'd nor otherwise appropriated and make Returns thereof into y^e Secret^{ys} Office which Survey by thee to be made by vertue hereof in case the said Herman—fulfill the above agreement by paying down the said one hundred pounds at y^e said Survey or in Six Months after the same with lawful Interest shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 6th day of y^e first month Anno Dni 1712₈
