



The Part marked *A* is an Interference of a Tract of 146<sup>ac</sup> 17<sup>ps</sup> & all ce surveyed on the above Warrant dated 11<sup>th</sup> Oct 1745 to William Wierman, and the Part marked *B* is an Interference of a Tract of 123<sup>ac</sup> 580<sup>ps</sup> & all ce surveyed on Warr<sup>t</sup> to John Reddock dated 10<sup>th</sup> Dece 1741 - both Tracts were included in one Patent from John Penn Esq<sup>re</sup> to Thomas West & Joseph West & Samuel Harlan & Sarah his Wife dated 29<sup>th</sup> June 1765. The whole is now situate in Menallen Township Adams County, owned by Samuel Harlan & Jacob Eyster.
