Surveyed the 12<sup>th</sup> day of December 1828 In pursuance of a Contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary Rights &c. on a Warrant Granted David Houston for 370<sup>ac</sup> of land on the Western Side of Clarks Creek a branch of Conococheague opposite the lower Side of John Blacks tract dated the 1<sup>st</sup> of March 1737.*
