



Situate on a run Leading into the West side of Shavers Creek in West township Huntingdon County containing one hundred and forty two acres and one hundred and sixty perches and allowance of six per cent. Surveyed the 23th day of May 1767 for George Hutchinson on order No. 1922 dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of November 1766.

No. 1581 Patd. Geo. Wilson, not patd

The dotted lines represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Robt Caldwell the 30th day of May 1777 on order No. 1181 dated the 18th day of October 1766. This tract interferes one hundred and forty one acres and one Hundred and fourteen perches with the George Hutchinson survey Robert Caldwell conveyed to George Hutchinson who administrators John Cannon Esqr and George Wilson conveyed to George Wilson who conveyed part to James Porter the present owner. The residue Geo Wilson devised to his heirs who sold to John Walls the present owner. The green lines represent part of a survey made for George Wilson on warrant dated September 17<sup>th</sup> 1812. this tract interferes one acres and forty six perches with George Hutchinson survey. George Wilson devised this part to his heirs who conveyed to John Walls the present owner.
