 No. 1 represents a survey made for John Gregory on warrant dated
 the 8th day of November 1784 this survey interferes one hundred and
 thirty six acres and twenty four perches with the Benjamin Bear
 tract John Gregory conveyed to John Coy the present owner.

No. 2. represents part of a survey made for Charles Rickets on warr-
 ant dated the 5th day of August 1794. This survey interferes twenty
 three acres and eighty nine perches with the Benjamin Bear survey
 Charles Rickets conveyed to Resire Rickets who conveyed to
 Hezikiah Covenhoven the present owner.

 conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of
 February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused
