



In pursuance of the Several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government and ^{by} Authority from the Board of Property I have this 16th day of May 1828 surveyed the above described tract of two hundred and thirteen acres and allowance of six per cent about six miles from Crooked Creek joining or nearly joining lands granted to Moses Gurrmins by warrant of the 23^d of July 1773 Situate in Mahoning township Indiana County. By virtue of a warrant granted to James Brown on the 6th of April 1774.
