



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by the authority of the Board of Property. I have this 7th day of May 1838 Surveyed the above described tract of Fifty eight acres and sixty three perches and allowance of six per cent on the east side of Black legs creek four miles above John Leslies including an improvement made by James Hamilton Situate in Conemaugh township in the county of Indiana By virtue of a warrant granted to William Fraimer the 1st day of August 1774.
