Surveyed 9th September 1828 in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented Lands under Proprietary rights &c. And by virtue of an order of survey granted to George Hellman for 100 acres joining Jacob Frush, Jacob Hick and David Kellar in Guilford township, bearing date 17th

November 1766. No. 1903 ~~alias 1703~~.

Note. The Location of the above order seems to be fairly ascertained from the fact that the land was formerly called George Hellmans as by an office Draft thought not purporting to be made on any office right, yet the old order marked executed.

Report. The above described tract is wholly the same as a tract of 82<sup>a</sup> 95<sup>ps</sup> Survey<sup>d</sup> 20 June 1793 on warrant to John Dunlop dated 15 May 1793 which tract is owned by the heirs of Christian Shetter decd & John Coble it is presumed under the title founded on Dunlops warrant. Emanuel Crossland tenant on Shetters part & Saml<sup>r</sup> Hellar tenant under Coble.
