



In pursuance of the several acts of assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations ~~and~~ other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property I have this 10th day of May 1828 surveyed the above described tract of land containing two hundred and eighty four acres & a half & allowance of six per cent joining John Vanderin Junr. extending westerly and including coal run & a white oak tree marked I.V.D. Situate in Armstrong township in the county of Indiana by ~~virtue~~ virtue of a warrant granted to Jonathan Paul the 8 of February 1776.
