



Claim of Thomas Flaman,

In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other Office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by authority from the Board of Property. I have this 7th day of May 1828. Surveyed the above described tract of two hundred acres and allowance of six per cent lying on one of the branches of Blackleggs creek on the ~~west~~ East Side joining land claimed by Thomas Freeman situate in Conemaugh township Indiana ^{County}. By virtue of a warrant granted to John Rannels Senr the 28 of March 1774.
