



The above black lines describe a tract of land situate in Juniatta Township, Perry County originally surveyed ~~the~~ October 10th, 1769, in granted Joseph Marshall for 300 a dated May 25th, 1769, No. 5490. Containing as p-old draught 124 as. Resurveyed January the 8th, 1831, agreeable to the original lines and contains one hundred seventy three acres, one hundred thirty nine perches & allowance of six per cent for roads.
