



Situate on the south side of the Frankstown Branch of Juniatta  
 — in Frankstown township Huntingdon County containing one hun-  
 dred and twenty nine acres and forty nine perches, and allowance  
 of six per cent for roads. Surveyed for William Honeymoon on  
 order No. 2643 dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1767.

Andrew & William Deverney Pat<sup>d</sup>

The dotted lines represent part of a survey made for Andrew  
 & William Deverney on warrant dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of Decem-  
 ber 1785. This tract interferes one hundred and twenty two acres  
 and ninety two perches with the William Honeymoon survey  
 Andrew & William Deverney conveyed to George Gibson & Abra-  
 ham Robbison the present owners.

No 2 represents an interference of a survey made for Abraham  
 Robbison on an Improvement dated ——— in 1786. This survey  
 interferes six acres and one hundred and sixteen perches with  
 the William Honeymoon tract. Abraham Robbison devised the  
 same to James Robbison whose widow & heirs now own the  
 same.

 the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made  
 conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of
