



William Penn Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> Province of Pennsylvania & y<sup>e</sup> Territories thereunto belonging.

At y<sup>e</sup> Request of Henry Gibbs y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him to take up two hundred Acres of land at Susquahanna, & a Lot in y<sup>e</sup> town where a Plot layd out for it. These are to will & require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him y<sup>e</sup> said number of Acres & Lot (both w<sup>ch</sup> I have freely given him<sup>to</sup> paying y<sup>e</sup> yearly quitrent as old purchasers do) & improving it according to regulations & make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
