Then layd out for Frances Harrison 250 acres of land lying on ye (obl.) side of Parsons Creek beginning at a marked beche standing by a branch of the sd creek being the esterdmost bounds of Thomas garrots land and from thence running S. W. 160 perches to a marked Beche being the westermost bounds of Thomas garrots. and from thence running S for 8 perches to a marked red oke from thence up a branch of the sd creek westerley to a marked popler from thence N 100 perches to a marked Chesnut tree from thence E b. S 90 perches to a marked whitte oke from thence N. N. E 10 perches to a marked Beetch tree from thence N. E b. N 32 perches to a marked popler from thence N 60 perches to a marked red oke from thence N. N. E 34 perches to a marked whitte (obl.) being the corner tree of walter ~~of~~ martens land
