At the request of Michael Harland That we would grant him to take up two hundred and ^{fifty} acres of vacant land in this Province, for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use Ten pounds, for each hundred and so proportionably These are to Authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Michael according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two hundred and fifty acres (or so much more as he shall think fitt to take) of ~~vacant~~ land in the said Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up, nor is seated by the Indians. And make a return thereof into the Secretaries office in order to a further Confirmation which survey in case the said Michael comply with the afore-said agreement within three months after ~~&~~ location shall be valid, otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 23^d day of the first month A.D. 171³/₄.
