Upon an agreement made with Michael Harland of the County of Chester for two thousand five hundred acres of land ~~on the north east side of Nottingham~~ These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Michael Harland in the place aforesaid the said quantity of Two Thousand five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretarys Office which survey in case the said Michael shall settle and improve the said tract of land within six months after the date hereof and fulfil his agreement for the same shall be valid otherwise the said survey ^{it} is to be void as if had never been made or this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the seventh month Anno Dom 1714.
