By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of Samuel Heald of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up a parcel of land adjoining to John Hopes land near Brandywine creek supposed to contain one hundred and eighty acres or there about for which he agrees to pay to the proprietors use sixteen pounds for the hundred acres and soe in proportion for the rest and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for ye said hundred acres and in like proportion for what is more. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Samuel Heald in the place aforesaid the said quantity of one hundred and eighty acres of land Provided the same be clear of all other Lawfull claims and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Samuel fulfill the above agreement at location thereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18th day of the 3rd
