By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of John Harry of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up in or near the township of Ughtland in the said County one hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors twelve pounds ten shillings money of this Province and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for the same These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said John Harry in the Place aforesaid according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated, and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said John fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 6th day of ye 8th month Anno Dⁿⁱ 1716.
