

Whereas the Commissioners of Property by their warrant under their hands and the seal of Province dated the 15th day of September A.D. 1714 Grant unto Ezekiel Harlan the remainder of six hundred acres of land on the west side of Brandywine creek formerly laid out to Anthony Weston & Anthony Burgest and by them quitted & thrown up. This may certify that on the 15th day of November 1714 there was Survey'd to the said Ezekiel Harlan a certain part or parcel of the said tract Beginning at a Hickory tree marked ~~at~~ standing by the said Brandywine creek and at a corner of Joseph Gilpins land and running south west by the said Joseph Gilpins line 260 perches to a corner post Thence ^{north} ~~west~~ west by other land of the said Ezekiel Harlan one hundred and eighty perches Then by the same land north east one hundred eighty five perches to a corner post Then south ⁶¹ ~~61~~ East by Joseph Taylors land one hundred and fifteen perches to a post Then by the same land north east one hundred perches to a corner maple by the said creek Then down the same on several Courses ninety two perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred and fifty acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twelfth day of May 1909.
