



Pursuant to a warrant from the Proprietors Comm^{rs} dated the 26th of the 2^d mo. 1707. I survey'd to Ezekiel Harlan a certain tract of land on a Branch of Brandewine in ye County of Chester

Beginning at a Corn(obl) marked black oak being a corner of Benjamin Chambers land thence southwest by the same land 390 perches to a post thence south sixty one degrees easterly by vacant land 217 perches to a post Thence north east by vacant land 390 perches to a post thence north sixty one degrees westerly by the land of the said Benjamin Chambers 217 perches to the place of Beginning containing five hundred acres.
