By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Ezekiel Harland of the County of Chester that we would grant him the remainder of six hundred acres of land on the west side of Brandywine Creek formerly laid out to Anthony Weston and Anthony Burgess at one penny Sterling per acre and by them quitted and thrown up, for which the said Ezekiel agrees to pay to the Prop<sup>rs</sup> the sum of fifteen pounds per Hundred <sup>acres</sup> and the usual yearly Quitrent of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to survey to the said Ezekiel Harland the said land in the Place aforesaid and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office in order to a further Confirmation which survey in case the said Ezekiel fulfil the above agreement within three month after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this warrant ever granted Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the fifteenth day of the seventh month Anno Domini 1714.
