Hall: These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out in right of the sd. Ralph Withers the said quantity of five hundred acres of land according to the method of Townships that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is conceal^d nor seated by the Indians, and make returns into the general Surveyor's office at Philad^{ia} where this warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delv^d to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} 15th 4th 1703.
