At the request of Thomas Haywood late of the Kingdom of Great Britain but now of this Province that we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land contiguous and adjoining to those 750 acres lately Surveyd to him in ye County of Chester for w^{ch} he hath agreed to pay the sum of fifteen pounds of the Present Currency to the Prop^{rs} use. These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be surveyd to the sd Thomas Haywood the sd quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of vacant land in the place aforesd and make returns into the Secretaries office. Which survey in case the sd Thomas shall comply with the agreement aforesd within six months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no effect.
