At the request of Ezekiel Harland of the County of Chester. That we would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of land in this Province further in part of fifteen hundred Acres purchased by him (obl.) Richard Buffington of Margaret Cook Widow, which said fifteen hundred acres is the full (obl.) payment due to her of all her husbands and her own purchases of land in this Province. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the said (obl.) Kiel Harland the said five hundred acres (according to the method of townships appointed) (obl.) ~~five~~ of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is com<sup>o-b-l-</sup> nor seated by the Indians, and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. N(obl.) said five hundred acres is the first moiety <sup>or</sup> ~~and~~ half part of one thousand acres the s(obl.) Ezekiel's share in ye sd fifteen hundred acres. Given under our Hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1707.
