At the request of Jonathan Hayes of the County of Chester That we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres of land in the said County, for which he hath agreed to pay to the Proprietors use five and twenty pounds with the usually quitrent of one shilling Sterling  $\text{\textsterling}$  annuum for each hundred acres and so proportionably: These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said Jonathan Hayes according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred and fifty acres of vacant land in the said county that has not been surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make return thereof into the Secretaries office in order to a further Confirmation. Which survey in case the said Jonathan fulfill the said agreement within three months after location. Shall be valid, otherwise the same is to be void, as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & ye seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> ye 23<sup>d</sup> day of the first month A. D. 171<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>.
