*Upon an agreement now made with George Grist of the County of Chester for one hundred and fifty acres of land within the Manor of Rocklands for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifty pounds and the yearly quitrent of one shilling & sixpence<sup>sterling</sup> for the whole. These are to authorize & require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said George Grist within the said Manor in one regular tract according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred & fifty acres of land that has not been already survey'd to any other person. and make a return thereof into the Secretary's Office, which survey in case the said George Grist fulfil the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1716.*
