



Pennsylvania

By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas the Proprietary by a warrant under his hand and seal bearing date the 2^d of the 7th Month 1700. Granted to Christopher Pennock to take up in right of George & Francis Rogers five hundred acres of land in this Province, w^{ch} said five hundred acres the said Christopher conveyed to George Harland (being not then located) for the use of his brother Michael & Son Ezekiel and whereas the said Michael and Ezekiel before the Proprietaries last arrival seated themselves on a certain tract of land situate in the County of Chester adjoining on the line of Marlborow township and the land called James Stanfields without any legal authority for the same, w^{ch} land the sd Michael and Ezekiel request a survey in right of the Purchase aforesaid and upon these terms that they shall pay one bushel of wheat yearly rent for every hundred acres from their first seating thereon forever after: These therefore are in pursuance of the sd agreement to require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the sd George Harland for the use of the said Michael and Ezekiel the said five hundred acres of land in the right aforesaid where they the said Michael & Ezekiel are now seated and make returns thereof into the ^{General} Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be deliv^d thee attested by the Secretary who is also to take a duplicate of thy return into his office.
