By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas the Proprietor by deeds of lease & release bearing date the 2^d & 3^d dayes of March 1681 granted to Jno. Gloues of ffurnice pool in ye Palatinate of Chester Yeoman & his heirs &c, one thousand acres of land in this Province, all w^{ch} was survey'd to & taken up by the s^d Jno^s Glouer or his assigns And the Propriet^r by like Deeds dated ye 23^d & 24th of April 1683^{so} Granted to the said Jno. Gloues five hundred acres of land to be further taken up in this said Province. And by his last will bearing date ye 29th day of ye 11th Moth 1686 ye sd Jno. Gloues. Granted and bequeath'd all the sd 500 acres to his three daughters Margery Hough Sarah Bainbridge & Rebecca Gloues & their heirs to be divided in three equal parts or shares. In pursuance whereof there has been survey'd to the s^d Margery Hough one hundred acres in part of her proportion according to ye method of townships or share: Now these are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the s^d Margery Hough, Sarah Bainbridge & Rebecca Gloues or to those that legally represent them the remaining four hundred acres of land in this Province that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor seated by the Indians. And make return thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the tenth day of September 1712.
