



By virtue of a warrant from ye Proprietors Commi^{rs} dated the 5th day of ye 9th mo. 1714. I survey'd to Rich^d Harrald a Certain tract of land ^{north} of Nottingham in ye County of Chester.

Beginning at a corner marked Chestnut tree ^{standing near a branch of north east}, thence south west by vacant land three hundred & thirty perches to a black oak thence east south east by vacant land two hundred & eighty perches to a post thence north east by a line of marked trees three hundred & thirty perches to a black (o - b - 1 - 12") north west by vacant land two hundred and eighty perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing five ^{and eighty} hundred acres with the allowance of six P^{er} cent.

Survey'd & lay'd out by the Gen^l Surv^r ord^d the 19th day of April 1716.
