

Pursuant to a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 23^d of April Anno—1716.

Resurveyd the 7th of the 3^d month 1716 unto Joshua Hastings a certain piece of land in the Welch tract in the County of Chester being the remainder of his original purchase of one thousand acres formerly laid out to him as Part thereof. Beginning at a corner tree of a tract of land reputed Thomas Pascals thence by a line ^{of} James Gibbons land west south west one hundred and eighty perches to a corner post Then north north west by a line of marked trees one hundred sixty eight perches to a post Then east north east one hundred and eighty perches by the land Griffith Owen & other land to a post Then by the aforesaid land reputed Thomas Pascals south south east one hundred and sixty eight perches to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and eighty acres with with an addition or allowance of above six per cent.
