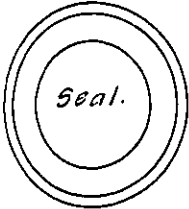


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Daniel Herrman late of Bohemia in Maryland but now of Chester County in this Province that we would grant him to take up within the said County two hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use twenty pounds for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling ~~per~~ for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said Daniel Herrman within the sd County of Chester according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Daniel fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & seal of the Province at Philad. the 15th day of ye first month Anno Dni 1715/6
